

Boston and Salem, MA
3 days 2 nights hotel

Day 1:

- a.m. Depart from your camp for Boston, MA.
- p.m. Highway stop for lunch on your own.
- p.m. Arrive for guided walking tour of the Historic Freedom Trail (1 guide per bus) to include walk past State Street, Old South Meeting House, Old State House, Faneuil Hall, Paul Revere House, etc. Any entrance fees are additional.
- p.m. Visit the USS Constitution at the Charlestown Navy Yard with advance reservations, subject to schedule.
- p.m. Dinner at a local restaurant.
- p.m. Admission to the Prudential Skywalk Observatory which offers a breathtaking 360 degree view of Boston, 700 feet in the air.
- Note:** Certain times may be closed on occasion for private functions.
- p.m. Depart for a local hotel outside of Boston such as Hampton Inn or equivalent, subject to availability.
- p.m. Arrive at the hotel. Time to check in and enjoy the hotel facilities.

Day 2:

- 8:00 a.m. Continental breakfast at the hotel.
- 9:00 a.m. Depart for Salem, MA.
- 10:00 a.m. Stop at the Salem Visitor Center.
- 10:45 a.m. Entrance to the Salem Witch Museum. An audiovisual presentation about the witch trials of 1692 is offered every half-hour. The Salem Witch Museum examines one of the most enduring and emotional events in American History...the Witch Trials of 1692. The main presentation is based on actual trial documents. Visitors experience the drama of that dark time through thirteen life-size stage sets, figures, lighting and a stirring narration as they are witness to the web of lies and intrigue of the Salem Witch Hunt. Live guides take you through changing interpretations of witches, the truth behind the stereotypes, witchcraft practice today and the frightening phenomenon of witch hunting.

- p.m. Admission to the House of Seven Gables, Monday – Friday. Surround yourself with the rich history of a house made famous by Nathaniel Hawthorne’s novel. The guided tour through the Tuner-Ingersoll Mansion (1668) better known as The House of Seven Gables, explores the lives of the 2 prosperous merchant families, the mansion’s unique architecture and Nathaniel Hawthorne’s connection to this legendary home.



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Enjoy strolling through the three-season Colonial Revival Gardens, where breathtaking views of Salem Harbor, and Derby Wharf await.

Visit the Museum store, located in the historic Retire Beckett House (1655), stocked with unique items and souvenirs.

Note: Admission on a Saturday or Sunday to the House of Seven Gables is an additional fee.

5:30 p.m. Dinner at a local restaurant.

7:30 p.m. 60-90 min. "Haunted Footsteps" Guided Walking Ghost Tour of Salem, subject to schedule. The "spirited, costumed" guide combines captivated storytelling, macabre humor and unmatched presentation to convey Salem's authentic haunted history. Delve into the city's dark past as the costumed narrators recount by lantern light true tales of documented paranormal activity, chilling cemeteries, Victorian murder and Colonial witchcraft.
