a.m. Depart for the Ancient Spanish Monastery in North Miami Beach.

a.m. Visit the Monastery of St. Bernard de Clairvaux, originally built in Segovia, Spain during the 12th century. Cistercian monks occupied the monastery for nearly 700 years. In 1925, the monastery was purchased by William Randolph Hearst who has it dismantled and shipped to the United States in 11,000 crates which were sitting in a Brooklyn warehouse for 26 years. After Hearst's death in 1952, the monastery was put back together and used as a tourist attraction. The monastery is now open to visitors on a daily basis, subject to schedule

p.m. Lunch on your own.

p.m. Visit Miami's Freedom Tower, a 14-story Mediterranean-Revival style tower built in 1925. It sits along downtown Miami's main thoroughfare, Biscayne Boulevard. The tower was used to provide immigration services to incoming Cuban immigrants. The Freedom Tower was the first place Cubans fleeing Fidel Castro would go to get basic medical services and records on relatives in the United States. Today the Freedom Tower houses a museum chronicling the advances made by Cuban Americans in this country.

p.m. Guided familiarization tour of Miami's most popular sites.

p.m. Depart for Boomers.
