p.m. 3 hour Guided tour of Providence RI:

Founded in 1636 by Roger Williams, who was banished from Massachusetts for his religious views, Providence was named in gratitude "for God's merciful providence unto me in my distress." A monument on Gano Street between Power and Williams streets marks the site where Williams first stepped ashore. A statue in Prospect Terrace, at Congdon and Cushing streets, marks his grave.

Providence is Rhode Island's capital as well as an educational, arts and medical center. Educational facilities also influence the city's economic and cultural base. The city is home to Brown University, Johnson and Wales University, Providence College, Rhode Island College and the Rhode Island School of Design, near which the art community of the College Hill-Benefit Street area thrives.

Shopping areas: Dating from 1828, The Arcade on Westminster and Weybosset streets is a Greek Revival structure and a forerunner of enclosed shopping malls. This landmark has been updated with specialty stores and restaurants. Renovated commercial buildings on South Main Street, along the Providence River, now house restaurants, offices and shops.

Wayland Square, on the eastern side on the city, offers diverse shops in an early 20th-century neighborhood. Thayer Street has several shops and galleries. Providence Place Mall, at Memorial Boulevard and Francis Street, has more than 150 stores, a 16-screen cinema and an IMAX® theater.

p.m. Dinner at a local restaurant.

p.m. Depart for Newport, RI.

p.m. 90 min. guided walking lantern led Ghost Tour through Newport's oldest historic district. Private groups can select what time to begin their tour.

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Costumed guides tell tales of the history and hauntings of **Newport**.
