

San Antonio, Texas with Musical Performance
3 Days 2 Nights



Day 1:

- a.m.** Depart from your School for San Antonio, TX.
- a.m.** Arrive in San Antonio, TX.
- p.m.** Visit **Paseo Del Rio (Riverwalk)**, in the heart of downtown and the pride of the city. Cobblestone walkways lead visitors to the river-level restaurants and shops. The river bubbles to the surface on the grounds of the University of the Incarnate Word and flows downtown and beyond threading its way through the city one level below the city streets. Along the horseshoe shaped riverbed, the river is shaded by towering cypresses, oaks and willows and bordered by gardens of flowering ornamental plant. Walk, shop, dine, and enjoy the hospitality of our world-renowned urban waterway.
- p.m.** Depart for your hotel. Check in and time to freshen up for Dinner.
- p.m.** Dinner at the **Hard Rock Café** or at a local restaurant, subject to availability
- p.m.** **60 min. narrated sightseeing cruise** with GO RIO Cruises along the San Antonio River, subject to cruise schedule and depending upon the number of people in your group. We will be booking entire boats, each of which hold about 34-38 passengers, so that the group is together.

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p.m. Return to hotel

Day 2:

a.m. Flow into the common area for deluxe continental breakfast at the hotel.

a.m. Depart for the Historic Market Square

a.m. Visit Historic Market Square aka el Mercado de San Antonio. Time for sightseeing / shopping on own. Enjoy the lively music of the mariachis and the folkloric dancers. Visit the famous 'Mi Tierra' the 24-hour Café and Bakery. Market Square is authentically Mexico and further enriched with a legacy of public markets. Set your sights on rows of crafts such as leather goods, blankets, apparel, pottery, jewelry and other interesting regional products.

***** Once a thriving hot spot for local produce, the Farmer's Market Plaza across from Market Square now houses a food court and unique locally owned shops and stalls offering a wide variety of products celebrating the cultural, artistic and ethnic influences of the Southwest and Mexico, from clothing to wood carvings to tasty local treats and candies.

p.m. Lunch on own.

p.m. Time to walk around The Alamo, originally known as a Spanish outpost called the Mission San Antonio de Valero, remains a symbol of Texas' pride and independent spirit. Today the Alamo is the heart of San Antonio and it is Texas' most visited historic landmark. Home of the famous 1836 battle and to living history demonstrations and special events throughout the year, the beautiful 300-year-old former Spanish mission turned fortress is open year-round and is free for families, school groups and everyone to visit, experience the battlefield first hand, and "remember the Alamo." Visitors can view the chapel, a reminder of the Fort's original function as a mission.

Option: Performance opportunity for your group at the Cavalry Courtyard, subject to approval. Groups may not exceed 75 performers. Music performed must be appropriate for the site. Patriotic, traditional and secular music is recommended.

p.m. Dinner at a local restaurant at the Riverwalk, subject to availability.

p.m. Self-guided visit of HemisFair Park. Built to host the 1968 World's Fair, the parks lushly landscaped areas and dramatic, cascading waterfalls offer a refreshing retreat from city streets. The park houses several historic buildings, the Institute of Texan Cultures

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and the Instituto Cultural Mexicano. One of the park's biggest (literally) highlights is the 750-foot tall Tower of the Americas which offers breathtaking views of San Antonio.

p.m. Return to your hotel.

Day 3

a.m. Flow into the common area for deluxe continental breakfast at the hotel.

a.m. Depart for Sea World San Antonio

a.m. Admission at Sea World, San Antonio, TX. Sea World San Antonio is a 250-acre marine mammal park, oceanarium, and animal theme park. Experience some of the most amazing San Antonio attractions at SeaWorld®.

Challenge yourself to the 360-degree flips of The Great White or the 15 story plunges of Steel Eel! Enjoy memorable live shows and unique attractions such as Penguin Encounter® and Pacific Point Preserve. Most importantly, SeaWorld is all about animals: From killer whales to belugas, penguins to bottlenose dolphins and sea lions to sharks, marine life abounds!

Spend the day in Sea World, subject to park hours.
