Washington, DC, “The Capital City”, is a compact city on the Potomac River, bordering the states of Maryland and Virginia. It’s defined by imposing neoclassical monuments and buildings – including the iconic ones that house the federal government’s 3 branches: The Capitol, White House and Supreme Court – but also its museums and performing-arts venues.

Day 1:

- a.m.** Depart from your school for the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum located at 100 Raoul Wallenberg Pl SW, Washington, DC 20024.
- p.m.** Highway stop for lunch on own.
- p.m.** Arrive. Admission to United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. ***Subject to availability*** It is a memorial to the millions who died during the Nazi regime in Germany

Option: **Instead of going to United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, visit the National Museum of Natural History.**

p.m. **Depart for World War II Memorial located at 1750 Independence Ave SW, Washington, DC 20024.**

p.m. **Arrive. Visit the National World War II Memorial.**
National World War II is the first national memorial dedicated to all who served during WWII. The memorial honors all military veterans of the war, the citizens on the home front, the nation at large, and the idealism that motivated the nation's call to arms.

p.m. **Walk towards Lincoln Memorial located at 2 Lincoln Memorial Cir NW, Washington, DC 20002.**

p.m. **Arrive. Visit Lincoln Memorial.**
The Memorial is dedicated to our 16th President. The giant seated figure of Lincoln overlooks the Reflecting Pool, the Washington Monument and the Capitol. Memorial walls are inscribed with passages from the Gettysburg Address and Lincoln's second Inaugural Address.

p.m. **Depart for Hard Rock Café.**

p.m. **Arrive. Dinner at the Hard Rock Café. *Subject to availability***

p.m. **Meet your guide for 90 minutes Guided Illumination Tour.**
The illuminated tour provides a unique perspective to visitors as they witness DC by night when the memorials are in their splendor with picture taking on own.

p.m. **Depart for a local hotel.**

p.m. **Arrive. Check-in, relax and enjoy hotel facilities.**

Day 2:

a.m. **Continental breakfast at the hotel.**

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- a.m. Depart for National Museum of African American History and Culture located at 1400 Constitution Ave. NW, Washington, DC 20560.**
- a.m. Arrive. Admission to the National Museum of African American History and Culture. *Subject to availability***
The National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC) is a Smithsonian Institution and is the only national museum devoted exclusively to African American culture. There are 85,000 square feet of exhibition space, nearly 3000 objects related to such subjects as community, family, the arts, religion, civil rights, slavery, and segregation, 12 exhibitions, 13 different interactives with 17 stations, and 183 videos housed on five floors. The pace at which you choose to tour the Museum will determine the length of your stay. It has close to 37,000 objects in its collection.
- a.m. Walk towards Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center located at 1300 Pennsylvania Avenue NW, Washington, DC 20004.**
- p.m. Arrive. Meal vouchers for lunch at the Ronald Reagan Building's Food Court. *Subject to availability***
- p.m. Depart for National Museum of the American Indian located at 4th St SW, Washington, DC 20560.**
- a.m. Arrive. Visit National Museum of the American Indian.**
The NMAI cares for one of the world's most expansive collections of Native artifacts, including objects, photographs, archives, and media covering the entire Western Hemisphere, from the Arctic Circle to Tierra del Fuego.
- p.m. Depart for United States Capitol Visitor Center located at First St SE, Washington, DC 20515.**
- p.m. Arrive at United States Capitol Visitor Center.**
- p.m. Tour of the US Capitol Visitor Center. *Subject to availability***
Visit the U.S. Capitol, the city's epicenter and the heart of the American legislature. George Washington laid the first cornerstone for the building in 1793, but the edifice was set on fire in 1814 when British troops marched through the city. Much of the structure was salvaged, thanks to heavy rains that quelled the flames, and the Capitol remains the symbol of American government today.

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Option: **For an additional cost, instead of going to the US Capitol Visitor Center, the group can go to the Museum of Bible.**

- p.m. Depart for your hotel.
- p.m. Arrive. Freshen up for the dinner cruise.
- p.m. Depart for the Dinner Cruise boarding location.
- p.m. Arrive. Start boarding the cruise.
- p.m. 2.5 hours of student dinner DJ Cruise.*Subject to cruise schedule & availability*
- p.m. Cruise ends. Depart for your hotel.
- p.m. Arrive. Relax and enjoy hotel facilities.

Day 3:

- a.m. Continental Breakfast at the hotel.
- a.m. Check out from hotel and Meet your Tour Escort.
- a.m. Depart for the Arlington Memorial Cemetery in Arlington, VA.
Approx. 30 minutes of driving time depending upon the traffic.
- a.m. Arrive. Visit Arlington National Memorial Cemetery with a self-guided walking tour.
To include Changing of the Guard, *Subject to schedule*.
Here is the final resting place of thousands of American soldiers, sailors and airmen.
President John F. Kennedy and his brother Robert F. Kennedy are buried here.
- a.m. Visit the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier is Arlington National Cemetery's most iconic memorial. The neoclassical, white marble sarcophagus stands atop a hill overlooking Washington, D.C. Since 1921, it has provided a final resting place for one of America's unidentified World War I service members, and Unknowns from later wars were added in 1958 and 1984. The Tomb has also served as a place of mourning and a site for reflection on military service.
- a.m. Depart for Inner Harbor located at Baltimore, MD.

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p.m. Arrive at the Inner Harbor located at Baltimore, MD.

p.m. Lunch at a local restaurant.

p.m. Sightseeing and shopping on own.

Option 01: **For an additional cost, instead of going to “Inner Harbor”, the group can go to “Great Blacks in Wax Museum”.**

Option 02: **For an additional cost, instead of going to “Inner Harbor”, the group can go to “Maryland Science Center”.**

p.m. Depart for your school.
Approx. 6 hours of driving time depending upon the traffic.

p.m. Stop along highway for dinner on own.

p.m. Arrive at your school.
